Your options after Year 11

School Leaving Age

Students leave school on the last Friday in June at the end of the Year 11.

They must then participate in one of the following until they are 18:

- Stay in full-time education;
- Start an apprenticeship or training; or
- Spend 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering, while in part-time education or training.

What counts as participating?

REMEMBER: You must be participating until you're 18.

Sixth form

- Entry requirements are set by individual schools
- Every school will have a different offer so have a look at multiple places



- Schools do not have to offer you a sixth form place
- You will most likely study multiple subjects
- St George's 6th form requires Grade 5's in most subjects

- Colleges will set various entry requirements depending on the course
- We recommend applying for more than one course or college
- You will most likely focus on one subject
- College can offer a more practical learning environment - with a work placement



TIP: Visit as many places as possible by going to open days.

Apprenticeships

- A full-time job (minimum of 30 hours per week)
- 80% - working 20% Training
- From Level 2- Level 7
- Minimum wage is £5.28 per hour.
- English and Maths is important if you want to do an apprenticeship.



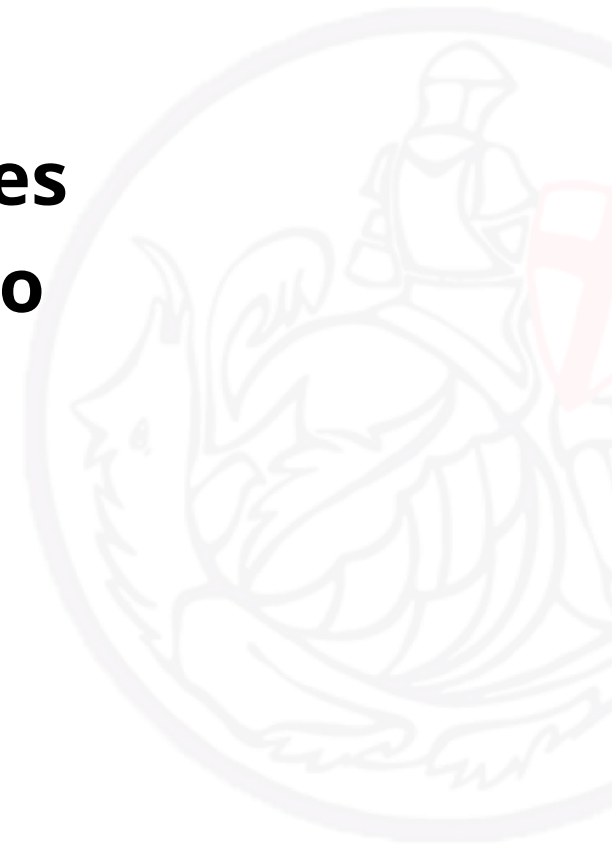
TIP: Apprenticeships are competitive – so you will need to apply for as many as possible.

Overview

Criminology is an area of sociology that focuses on the study of crimes, their causes, effects and social impact. This course will give you a great insight into how to analyse data as a criminologist to understand why the crime was committed and to find ways to predict, deter and prevent future crimes from taking place.

Criminology is not just about catching thieves and criminals. It will not instruct you how to profile an offender, rather it will give you an insight into the world of crime from different perspectives, some of which you may not have considered. This course draws on a range of disciplines and subject areas including law, psychology, sociology, media studies and geography.

Study will be a mixture of in our classrooms on site and at our outreach centres in Canterbury and Medway

Study hours will be approx. 25 hrs p/week

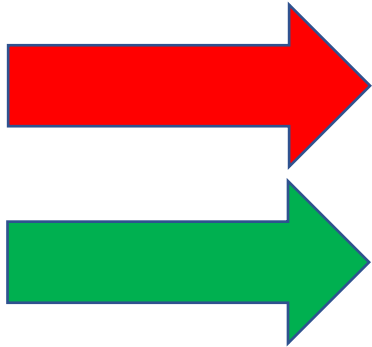

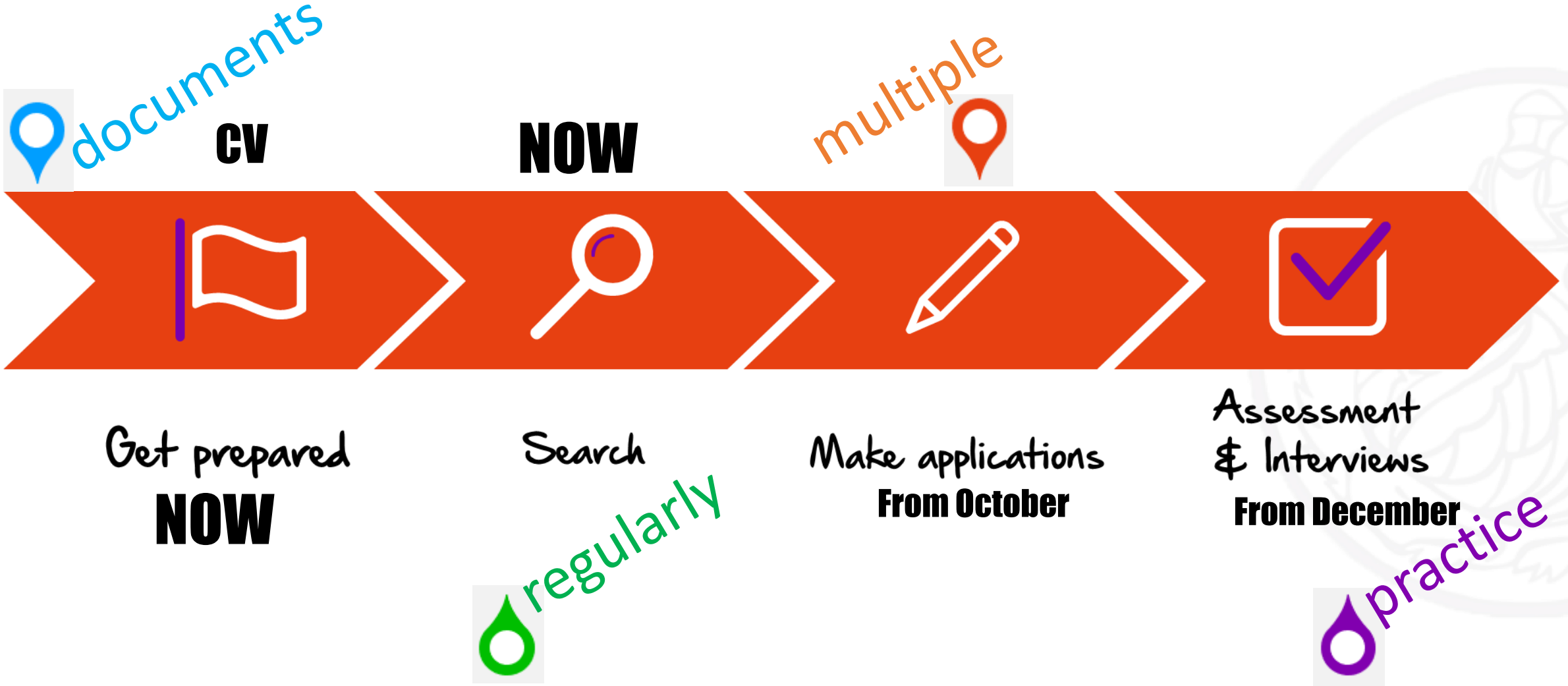
Apprenticeship Requirements

- **Some** will take with **Grade 2** but these are limited.





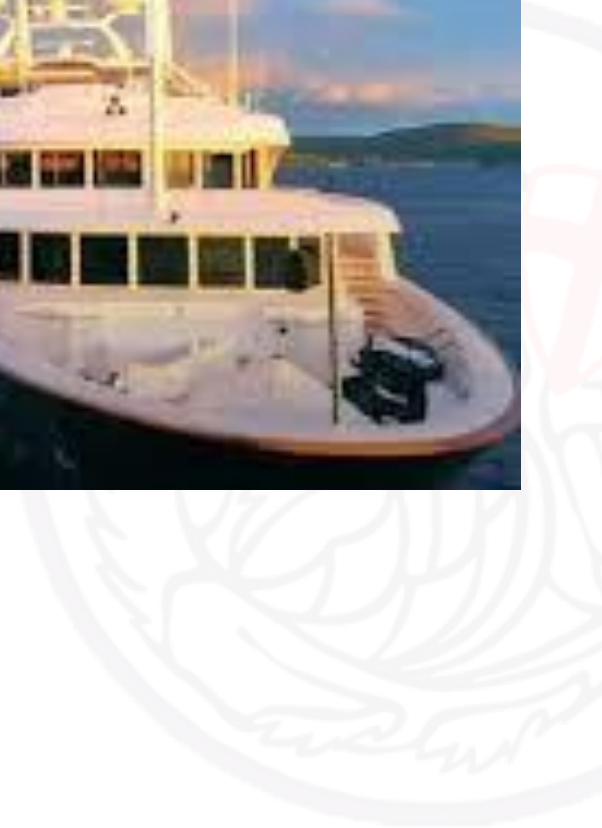
How to Get an Apprenticeship
