## GATSBY CAREER BENCHMARKS

	A stable careers programme	Every school and college should have an embedded programme of career education and guidance that is known and understood by students, parents, teachers, <u>governors</u> and employers.
	Learning from career and labour market information	Every student, and their parents, should have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities. They will need the support of an informed adviser to make best use of available information.
	Addressing the needs of each student	Students have different career guidance needs at different stages. Opportunities for advice and support need to be tailored to the needs of each student. A school's careers programme should embed equality and diversity considerations throughout
	Linking curriculum learning to careers	All teachers should link curriculum learning with careers. STEM subject teachers should highlight the relevance of STEM subjects for a wide range of future career paths.
	Encounters with employers and employees	Every student should have multiple opportunities to learn from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace. This can be through a range of enrichment activities including visiting speakers, mentoring and enterprise schemes.
	Experiences of workplaces	Every student should have first-hand experiences of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing and/or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities and expand their networks.
	Encounters with further and higher education	All students should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both academic and vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.
	Personal guidance	Every student should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a career adviser, who could be internal (a member of school staff) or external, provided they are trained to an appropriate level. These should be available whenever significant study or career choices are being made.

The Gatsby Benchmarks are a framework of 8 guidelines that define the best careers provision in secondary schools.

Have a wonderful summer and look out for more careers experiences next year that will help our students flourish in the future!

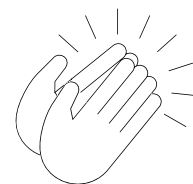

This 6-month programme is designed to help your students build an impressive portfolio for UCAS. Admissions teams for healthcare courses always notice when students go the extra mile to find out about their future careers in the NHS.

If your students don't have the time to complete all 6 months before your UCAS application deadline, don't worry! They can still enrol on each individual session. The next session, on Sunday 6th August is on Pain Management and Mental Health. They will follow two patients: Anita and Yasmin.

Anita is a 70-year-old woman who had an osteoporotic crush fracture to her T6 about 6 weeks ago. Consulting her GP on ongoing pain, we will follow Anita's journey with physiotherapists, neurologists, nurses, speech and language therapists, and dieticians.

Yasmin, in her 30s, has been suffering from an acute manic episode over the last 3 weeks. We will see how she is treated by paramedics, mental health nurses, and occupational therapists.

The NHS multidisciplinary team has a very distinct way of operating, so this is a rare opportunity for your students to gain insight into how they work within their careers and across healthcare departments.

We look forward to seeing your students on Sunday 6th August! When they complete the Allied Healthcare Work Experience programme, they will be awarded a certificate to add to their UCAS application!

Places are £10 a session to cover administrative and technological costs. If you are in need of financial support, please contact school during term time.

### Nearly 1 in 6 clinical training places to be offered as apprenticeships by 2028

NHS workforce plan commits to triple the number of apprentice nurses and boost medical degree apprenticeships

Care apprenticeships will receive larger than expected funding increases. The amount of NHS clinicians that the government plans to train through apprenticeships will more than double in the next five years, according to a long-awaited report into boosting the NHS workforce.

Apprenticeships will help widen access to opportunities for people from all backgrounds and in underserved areas to join the NHS," the report said. The plan also reveals ambitions to boost overall adult nursing training places by 92 per cent, taking the total number of places to nearly 38,000 by 2031/32, achieved by expanding places to over 44,000 by 2028/29.

By 2028/29, the NHS will have 20 per cent of registered nurses qualifying through apprenticeship routes compared to just 9 per cent now.

### All systems are go for new space degree apprenticeship

A new degree apprenticeship in space engineering will open up more opportunities for young people to build rewarding careers in the space industry and train up the talent the sector needs to grow, Education Secretary Gillian Keegan announced today (14 July).

From spacecraft manufacturing to testing satellites, apprentices on the new Level 6 Space Systems programme will have a leading role in the development of complex, high value space hardware and ground support equipment.

The new apprenticeship will offer infinite opportunities for people to work in the UK's world-leading space industry, including for global aerospace companies, space agencies or institutions including universities and technology research and development laboratories.

The apprenticeship is the first of its kind at degree-level. Applications open in September, and apprentices will start work for Airbus and begin their degree training with delivery partners across the UK in September 2024. The curriculum was developed with the University of Leicester, and will be delivered with Space Park Leicester, where students will have access to specialist facilities and world-class expertise in space mission development. **Read more [here](#).**

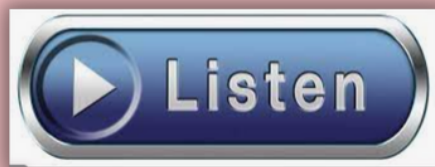

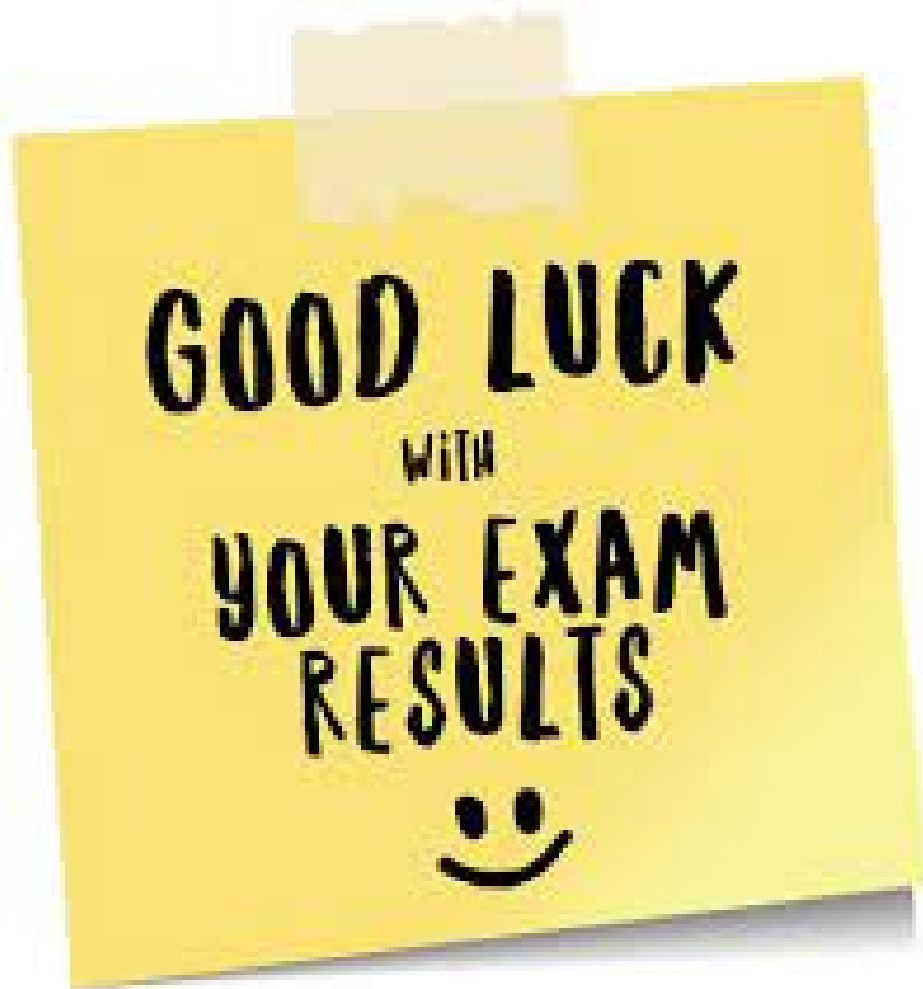
