YEAR 10 CHARLIE'S PROMISE

Year 10 students had an assembly delivered by Martin Cosser, Dad of Charlie and founder and CEO of <u>Charlie's Promise Charity</u>.

Charlie Cosser was a 17-year-old who was stabbed at a house party in July 2023 and, 3 days later, lost his life. His dad and the family have pledged that they will raise awareness around knife crime and the impact that this leaves on friends and family.

They have, in addition, made it their passion to educate young people. Charlie's Promise is a charity dedicated to helping the fight against the rising issue of knife crime in Surrey and across the UK, and they aim to help fight against the rising issue of knife crime in the UK by raising awareness of the dangers of both carrying and using a knife, by using their own real-life experience, they educate young people on the immeasurable impact knife crime has on the victim's family and friends, and the wider communities.



UNIVERSITY - WHAT'S ON

Durham University - Space to Explore Potential (STEP) 2025 are now open!

Durham University's Sutton Trust Summer School is designed to give bright students from under-represented backgrounds the chance to experience what it is like to be a student at a leading university.

The summer school is a fantastic opportunity to find out more about applying to university, to meet some of our current students and work with one of our 25 academic departments. Durham is one of the <u>Sutton Trust</u>'s partner institutions, and as such, students will have access to support and resources from the Sutton Trust too, including the Sutton Trust Online platform and the Alumni network. This programme is available for Year 12 students from UK state-maintained schools.

Changes to Personal Statements

The UCAS personal statement will change for students intending to apply to university through UCAS from September 2025 (for 2026 or 2027 entry).

The personal statement will be broken down into three sections rather than being written as one statement. Students will still be expected to demonstrate why they want to study the chosen course. The three sections are based on the following questions:

- 1. Why do you want to study this course or subject?
- 2. How have your qualifications and studies helped you prepare for this course or subject?
- 3. What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful?





Improvements to the Homepage

We've made a few updates to the student homepage based on your feedback.

- **Tool list:** The homepage now remembers the last-viewed tab if you stay signed in. The student side retains the view of either the 'Your tools' or 'All tools' tab, while the teacher side retains the last year group viewed.
