Literacy -'Fun in the Sun'

Can draw pictures of characters/ event / setting in a story

Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events & respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions and reactions. Phonics/Reading

Phonic Sounds: Little Wandle phonics: review/consolidate and extend learning.

Guided reading group work: Little Wandle scheme (3 sessions per week)
Read words containing familiar letter groups:

Phase 4 word reading and phonics focus.

Reading: Non-fiction texts, Internal blending, Naming letters of the alphabet. Distinguishing capital letters and lower-case letters.

Reading simple sentences with fluency. Reading CVCC and CCVC words confidently.
